THE ARTS



Year 9 Elective - Art

Course Description

This elective aligns with VCE Art Making and Exhibiting and is recommended for students who are interested in fields such as painting, sculpting, art teaching, visual arts and crafts professionals.

Throughout this course students will develop a range of art techniques in drawing, media, painting and printmaking. Selected finished art works will be displayed at the end of semester exhibition.

Year 9 Elective – Digital Art & Design

Course Description

This elective aligns with VCE Visual Communication Design and VCE Art Making and Exhibiting and is recommended for students who are interested in creative fields such as animation, advertising, illustration, interior design, marketing, graphic designer and signwriting.

Students will be introduced to techniques in animation, character design and the moving image. They will study the history of animation and utilise these new techniques to create their own short animations.

Students will explore the design process to develop visual imagery for different purposes, audiences and in response to specific needs. They will use a combination of freehand drawing techniques and software to develop their ideas. Students will also learn a range of typography techniques.

Throughout this subject, students will develop practical skills and critical thinking skills which will inform their work as artists and as an audience.

Year 9 Elective - Photography

Course Description

This elective aligns with VCE Art Making and Exhibiting and is recommended for students who are interested in creative fields such as photography, gallery or museum curator, graphic designer, visual artist, art teacher, magazine photo editor.

Students will learn the operation and function of a digital camera in the production of a folio of digital prints, landscapes.

Areas of Study

- Operation and function of a digital camera
- Aperture and shutter speed
- Composition, art elements and design principles in photography
- Editing/manipulation using Photoshop
- Developing a photography folio

Year 9 Elective - Drama

Course Description

In this unit students will be introduced to the influential theatrical styles from the Renaissance. Namely, students will explore the physical comedy and stock characters of Commedia Dell'Arte and the poetic and heightened style of Shakespearian theatre. Students will learn how these styles influenced modern performance, and why it is still so popular to this day. Students will participate in practical workshops, theory lessons and construct performances. Students will also have the opportunity to see a professional production in the style of Commedia Dell'Arte and Shakespearean theatre, in order to have a model for their own performance making.

Assessment Tasks

Learning Tasks for the unit include participation in workshops, mini performances and theory homework. Assessment Tasks will include a Commedia Dell'Arte Performance and Commedia Performance Analysis, Shakespearean Ensemble Performance and a Shakespeare Performance Analysis.

Proposed Topics

Commedia Dell'Arte:

- Understanding Stylised and Exaggerated Movement
- Lazzi Physical and Wordplay
- Stock Characters and their hierarchy
- Asides and Audience Interaction

Shakespearean Theatre:

- A brief historical look
- Tackling the Language
- Romeo and Juliet a text exploration
- Midsummer Nights Dream a text exploration

Year 9 Elective - Music

Course Description

Year 9 Music is aimed at inspiring students to develop a true passion for music and musical performance. This subject is aimed for students to further develop their musical skills and knowledge. You will have opportunities to play a range of styles of music in both group and solo performance, create your own music using technology, analyse a variety of different musical styles and understand the elements that are used to construct music.

Content

Year 9 Music is split into four main areas of study:

- **1.Musical Performance (Solo and Group):** Students will learn how to rehearse, interpret music and present chosen songs to the wider school community. Students will provide constructive feedback to your peer's performances as well as self-reflecting on your own rehearsals and performances.
- **2.Music Technology (Composition):** Using theory learned in class, you will create a song of your own using a program called Soundtrap. Students will learn how to modify loops, create drumbeats and create music with a range of instruments. At the end of the project, you will have created a complete finished song in an mp3 format.
- **3.Musical Analysis:** Students will learn a range of musical terminology and how to write and respond to music heard using musical language.
- **4.MusicTheory/Aural Comprehension:** Students will learn about rhythm, chords, intervals, and scales and how to apply these to your instrument in a practical way.



Year 9 Elective – Fashion and Product Design

Course Description

This course offers students the opportunity for self-expression, through the design and construction of several projects.

Students will be designing and making a backpack, a hooded jumper and a recycled garment project.

Students will be required to purchase fabric for their jumper and bring a garment for their recycling.

They will be required to follow a series of design briefs, which will encourage them to think about the final product and create a series of drawings. They will learn to follow a basic commercial pattern and increase their sewing machine skills. Students will also learn to evaluate their final product through completion of detailed self-assessment and evaluation questions.

Areas of Study:

- Introduction to course
- Introduction to commercial sewing patterns:
 - Placement of pattern and fabric
 - o Cutting out of garment
- Construction of garments:
 - Using a sewing machine and other equipment
- Revision of construction and evaluation of outcomes
- Students will complete a series of design assignments throughout the semester

Year 9 Elective – Food Technology

Course Description

This unit of study is a combination of investigating, designing and producing food from around the world and food suitable for special occasions. Students will look at how our diet has changed from early Indigenous Australian cuisine to how European settlers came and introduced new foods into Australia and changed the way we eat today.

Students will research key ingredients, cooking methods, typical meal patterns and rituals of each country investigated. Their culinary skills will further develop by learning how to cook a variety of foods for different occasions and from different continents.

They will have the opportunity to individually research, design and produce food products and then evaluate their skills.

Year 9 Elective – Team Sports

Course Description

In this elective, students will participate in and explore a variety of sports, including those commonly played in Australia, as well as international and alternative sports. Students will develop an understanding of the factors affecting the performance of an elite athlete, including their coach, nutrition and state of mind. Students will investigate the work of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) and Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA), to ensure sport is clean and fair for all, as well as ensuring elite athletes are positive role models. Furthermore, students will analyse common acute and chronic injuries in sport and examine different methods to prevent them from occurring.

LANGUAGES



Year 9 Elective - French

Course description

The Languages Pathway 2 curriculum in French focuses on the development of communication in a variety of social and cultural contexts in both written and spoken form.

Through multi-modal immersion and modelled use of language, the teaching and learning program will consolidate students' existing knowledge of French grammatical conventions, then extend upon students' personal vocabulary and knowledge of language structures such as verb tenses, definite and indefinite articles, along with possessive, personal, direct and indirect pronouns. Students will read, view, or listen to a range of multi-modal texts to obtain factual information on defined topics of interest in order to construct conversations with others or written reflections.

Students will develop a deep understanding of the close relationship between language and cultural conventions that recognise social norms of purpose and context in formal and informal communication. They will gain an understanding of diverse views and beliefs within a different cultural community as compared with their own and be able to articulate a preference, provide information or a point of view on a given topic.

DUKE OF EDINBURGH



Year 9 Elective – Duke of Edinburgh

Course Description

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award is a unique and exciting opportunity for young people (aged 14-25) to get out of their comfort zone and develop their initiative, self-esteem and sense of adventure.

It is the world's leading youth achievement Award, empowering young people with the skills and opportunities to realise their full potential and go beyond academic success. The Award is self-directed by each young person – they choose the activities they would like to pursue and set goals for each section.

In 2024 Pakenham Secondary College will be running the Duke of Ed Bronze Level Award as a Year 9 Elective across the whole year.

The time commitments for the Physical Recreation, Voluntary Service, and Skills Award sections are one hour per week for 13 weeks each. The Voluntary Service section will be completed during class time, whilst the Physical Recreation and Skills sections are to be completed in the student's own time, outside of school. Students must choose one of these sections as a major and are required to make a 6-month commitment to this section of their choice.

Students will be fully involved in the planning of two overnight camps for the Adventurous Journey section. The types of these camps will depend on the students' interests.

Other topics covered during classes include; Community, Teamwork, Personal Identity & Emotional Intelligence and Leadership. Students will also have the opportunity to attend excursions such as surfing, rock-climbing and other outdoor adventure activities.
